East Midlands Airport will be a leading international innovation hub, connecting the region's thriving economic network. It will create new business opportunities and double the number of jobs on site by improving connectivity between established manufacturing and logistics sectors.

At its heart, the airport will have high tech industries, advanced manufacturing and logistics specialists. It will capitalise on its location to provide a catalyst for the region to deliver a £500m development and create employment opportunities for its existing and new occupiers.




A VIBRANT REGION

East Midlands Airport is an international gateway that connects the Midlands, and the wider UK, into the global economy. Close by are Nottingham, Leicester and Derby, three cities that offer some of the most significant and productive companies specialising in healthcare, cutting edge design and advanced manufacturing.

The East Midlands is a high skills economy. Overall 30% of the working age population in the East Midlands is qualified to NVQ4 (diploma or degree level) or higher. 


Investigative businesses conducting studies to both improve existing, or develop new products and procedures will find themselves in a region of innovation at the East Midlands Global Gateway.


Manufacturers increasingly integrate new innovative technologies in both products and processes in their sector, making East Midlands Airport an ideal location for these businesses to locate.

HIGH TECH INDUSTRIES


With a focus on aerospace in particular, Derby is expanding as a centre for high tech businesses. Total employment of leading technology industries in Derby equate to over 14,000 employees and there is a growing cluster of knowledge and skills in high-value engineering for aerospace including global companies such as Rolls Royce, Bombardier and Toyota.

These high tech industries, which have large concentrations of workers in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) require a rich talent pool supported by the region's universities.

GLOBAL LOGISTICS

As the UK's largest pure cargo airport, East Midlands handles over 350,000 tonnes of cargo every year and is home to one of the world's largest express freight operation.

Established partners include DHL, UPS, TNT/ FedEx, Amazon and Royal Mail. All have chosen to locate not only their business but globally vital hubs at this prime location, with UPS securing planning consent for a substantial new investment.

The flow of resources and information between a business and the consumer remains vital to the UK economy and East Midlands Airport is the UK's global logistics gateway.

WORKING IN PARTNERSHIP



EAST MIDLANDS ENTERPRISE GATEWAY (EMEG)

East Midlands Airport sits at the heart of the East Midlands Enterprise Gateway (EMEG). EMEG is a unique central location for air passenger, cargo, rail and road transport and a range of supporting economic activities. EMEG's strong economic growth has been driven by investment of household names and their commitment to base themselves on-site. Along with the airport, DHL, Marks and Spencer and Donington Park have all invested in EMEG.

The East Midlands Gateway Strategic Rail Freight Interchange is also part of EMEG and is currently under construction in the area immediately to the north of the airport. Its completion will deliver 6m sq ft of rail-served logistics space. Ultimately the East Midlands Enterprise Gateway will generate 14,000 on-site jobs.

EMEG is recognised as a key growth area in both of the region's Local Enterprise Partnership's economic plans.

THE MIDLANDS ENGINE

Built on a strong advanced manufacturing base and enhanced by a range of sectoral strengths, the Midlands Engine is perfectly positioned to take advantage of economic growth, productivity and skills opportunities. It will improve the economy of the Midlands and the UK, deliver an enhanced quality of life for citizens and communities and become a globally recognised driver of the economy.




UNRIVALLED CONNECTIVITY

East Midlands Airport is centrally located between Nottingham, Leicester and Derby. It benefits from excellent accessibility, including direct road access to the M1, A(M)42, A453 and A50.

This provides unique transport connectivity with 90% of England and Wales within a 4 hour drive. The Midland Mainline is to the east of the airport only 10 minutes away and there are frequent (24hr) high quality bus services to Nottingham, Leicester, Derby, Loughborough and Long Eaton.

DRIVE TIMES



A range of transport developments and investments adjacent to the airport will further boost the connectivity of the area. These include:

Upgrading the M1 to SMART motorway status

Improved timetabling and service patterns on the Midland Mainline

EAST MIDLANDS GATEWAY STRATEGIC RAIL FREIGHT INTERCHANGE

Work is underway on the SEGRO Logistics Park East Midlands Gateway (SLPEMG), immediately to the north of the runway. The 700 acre development has planning consent for up to 6,000,000 sq ft of logistics accommodation. It incorporates a 50 acre Strategic Rail Freight Interchange (SRFI) which will include a rail freight terminal, capable of handling up to sixteen 775m freight trains per day, container storage and HGV parking.

HS2

The HS2 Hub Station at Toton between Nottingham and Derby will be the most connected station on the high speed network outside London. It will be a 21st century gateway to the East Midlands – and a destination in its own right.

Key to realising the significant economic benefits that HS2 will bring to the region is the interconnectivity between Toton, the major towns and cities surrounding it and other transport hubs and employment sites in the area, including the airport.

Whether it's new bus routes, an extended light or heavy rail network, improvements to roads, or a combination of all of these, we are championing the need for quick and efficient transport links between the airport and Toton.




A SUCCESSFUL & GROWING AIRPORT

The airport's aim is to deepen the role that it plays in the regional economy, driving growth through better connectivity, creating jobs and attracting investment. The airport has almost 8,000 people working on-site and it generates an annual £440m of GVA. This employment and GVA contribution has the potential to double over the next 20 years.

East Midlands Airport also has the ambition and the capability to substantially grow cargo and passenger numbers over the next 20 years. It expects to double its passenger throughput to 10m and to treble its cargo activity to 1m tonnes a year.


Recent developments in the passenger terminal, the airfield and the cargo facilities demonstrate the airport's commitment and the long-term opportunities available.

The airport's growth is supported in national aviation policy and in local economic, planning and transport plans.




Projected growth over next 20 years:
